Update: New Hepatitis A Immunization Eligibility for Outbreak Response

Dear Health Care Provider,

Manitoba Health, Seniors and Long-Term Care (MHSLTC), continues to identify new hepatitis A cases associated with the ongoing provincial outbreak. As of June 4, 2026, a total of 784 cases have been reported in Manitoba in this outbreak.

In response to the current outbreak, MHSLTC is updating Manitoba's hepatitis A immunization program to include **all children born on or after January 1, 2010, who are at least 6 months of age and who meet one or more of the following criteria:**

- live in an Indigenous community in Manitoba; OR
- travel regularly to Indigenous communities; OR
- have household visitors from Indigenous communities.

For children eligible under the criteria listed above, the hepatitis A vaccine is administered as a **two-dose series** and should be incorporated into routine immunization touchpoints as follows:

- **First dose** should be offered at routine visits (e.g., 6 months, 18 months, 4–6 years, Grade 6, and Grade 8/9).
- **Second dose** should be offered at the next routine immunization visit (e.g., a child who receives their first dose at the 18-month visit should receive their second dose at the 4–6-year visit). The minimum interval between doses is 6 months.

Please note that, for the current outbreak response, timely administration of the first dose should be prioritized over completing the full series. **The first dose is highly effective and provides protection for at least a decade.** The second dose can be administered at a later routine visit for expected lifelong immunity.

We strongly recommend that health care providers should prioritize and promote this Hepatitis A Immunization Program.
